Hip-hop legends Cypress Hill said they were due to fulfil their "destiny" last night by performing with the Londor Symphony Orchestra (LSO) making a Simpsons joke from 1996 come true.

B-Real (centre, with Eric Bobo and Sen Dog), real name Louis Mario Freese, said he and his bandmater were "blown away" when they first saw themselves portrayed on the long-running US cartoon decades ago. And he said they had been lanning the performance, which inally materialised at London's Royal Albert Hall, ever since.

Insane idea?

Cypress Hill formed in 1988. and shot to worldwide fame with 1993's Black Sunday, which eatured singles such as 'Insane in the Brain" and "I Ain't Goin' Out Like That". They have sold 20 million albums.

In The Simpsons episode "Homerpalooza", Cypress Hill speculate that they may have mistakenly booked the LSO, "possibly while high". After years of fan pressure, they turned the joke into reality.

Destiny

'After the episode came out, our producer, DJ Muggs, was like, 'That might actually be a cool idea." 3-Real said.

"We forgot about it, and before you know it, Wu-Tang was doing a symphony show. And we thought, well, f**k, that's our destiny... They have also played t shows in the US with the

Colorado Symphony. The Simpsons has form for orecasting the future, including Donald Trump's presidency and a tiger attack on the Las Vegas magicians Siegfried and Roy.



It was a match first dreamt up in an episode of The Simpsons 28 years ago.

Back then, Cypress Hill were the stars of West Coast gangsta rap, thanks to a chart-topping album in the US, Black Sunday, its edgy, bass-heavy sound overlaid with rhymes about smoking marijuana and shooting people. The joke in The Simpsons centred on the chaotic Latino-American hip hop group having hired the London Symphony Orchestra for a gig, only to get so stoned they forgot all about it.

Just as the cartoon famously "predicted" Donald Trump's presidency, so the classical/rap alliance actually came to pass after rapper Louis Freese, aka B-Real, now 54, approached the LSO.

As Freese led the band's contemporary incarnation to join the 70-strong orchestra onstage in the illustrious Royal Albert Hall, it 🔰 and accented by an army of sawing was hard to know what to expect. | bows and parping horns.



After all, the group's original music featured only the occasional screeching violin sample. When he kicked off a complete run-through of Black Sunday by yowling its unequivocal opener, I Wanna Get High, it was possible that this collision of cultures might turn out to be a car-crash.

Freese and co, however, rose to the occasion, lifting the sell-out crowd from their seats with the loping groove of IAin't Going Out Like That. The wind and string players added long-sustained notes to beef up the ruckus.

"Y'all feeling crazy?" Freese wondered as flagship hit Insane In The Brain launched on stabs of brass. They've used a brass section before, and this was like a supersized version, each track topped and tailed with a flourish,

On Cock The Hammer, the orchestration only amped up the music's inherent cinematic qualities; thereafter, a butler brought Freese and co-rapper Senen Reyes (Sen Dog) tequila shots, to toast a job well done.

There was limitless goodnatured fun here: announcing Hits From The Bong, Freese shared a conspiratorial grin with conductor Troy Miller, and asked the house to "give it the f--- up for Troy - that's a baaad man right there!"

On it went, with a selection of classics, including the trafficker's anthem Dr Greenthumb, and breakout hit How I Could Just Kill A Man, rendered with a cacophonous blast.

"Destiny fulfilled," beamed B-Real. In extraordinary circumstances, to be sure.




